Dear Parents and Carers

Since her appointment, I have met Miss Greenway on a number of occasions and I am delighted that we have recruited a Headteacher with such experience, obvious skills and clear commitment to building on the very best of Chilton Trinity. Finding someone who appreciates the core values, philosophy and achievements of our school whilst making a commitment to it being even better is certainly a very positive outcome and I am very grateful to the Governors, students and staff who were involved in Miss Greenway's appointment. The future of our school is in safe hands!

There will be time in the Summer term to say more about my time at Chilton Trinity but for the moment I would like to thank all of you who have already written in with your kind wishes and thoughtful cards and letters. The academic year got off to a great start in September as we celebrated our best exam results ever and our themed Ofsted inspection (focusing on how we promote positive behaviour and sort out bullying issues as and when they arise) went very well. Feedback about our school was extremely positive and I was proud of the way in which our students shared their experiences so openly with the two HMI who visited us.

Work continues on the development of our new school and those of you who have visited our site lately will know how advanced the construction is. There have been numerous site visits and it has been wonderful to see our vision for learning and teaching transformed into bricks and mortar. It really will be a stunning place for our young people to work and learn in. (I am also very proud of the fact that it will be a fantastic community resource too, complementing the newly opened Leisure Centre and the soon-to-be-built pool.) The facilities and resources available will be second to none.

Whilst there were many exciting opportunities for learning throughout the term, a number of key events come to mind. Our Open Evening and Open Mornings went really well and we had fantastic feedback from the many visitors who came to see us in action. Our European Day of Languages promoted a lot of curiosity amongst our students and has prompted a number of them to choose a Modern Language to study in KS4—a very wise decision given the importance of our European partnerships locally. In November, our Remembrance Day commemorative activities were a fantastic tribute to our armed services and those who have been affected by conflict. The activities culminated in a very moving ceremony during which a representative from each tutor group planted poppy seeds in a memorial garden. Citations and poems were read and the event was screened throughout the school so that all students could participate. The respect and thoughtful care that our students demonstrated was both moving and a source of huge personal pride.

Helping others in need has always been a strong feature of our work as a school community and Children in Need 2011 was no exception. Throughout the weeks leading up to the 18<sup>th</sup> November, students, ably led by Miss Pow, worked hard to raise money and awareness of the challenges that some young people face. Having a better understanding of the needs of others in our society is an important aspect of education in its broader sense at Chilton Trinity and I appreciate the thoughtful way our student leaders organised all the events and activities.

Global entrepreneurship and making a commitment to serving others was also a feature of a fantastic Enterprise Day that a group of our Year 9 students took part in at Preston School. Their endeavours will eventually lead to the construction of three schools in Laos and Nepal and their response to the "Go Global Challenge" was fantastic.

Welcoming our wonderful Year 11 back for the presentation of their GCSE certificates and other awards was a timely reminder of how important relationships for learning are at Chilton Trinity and it was a joy meeting them all again and celebrating their achievements with their proud families. They had worked hard and thoroughly deserved recognition of their success.

Celebrating achievements and also focusing on areas to be improved was, of course, an important feature of Target Review Evening and Target Review Day and I am very grateful to you as families and to our staff for participating so actively in the process. It was a great success and a useful reminder that by working together we can achieve the very best for your children. Your support and partnership means a great deal to us. Thank you.

This year, our Upper School production has taken place during this last week of term and, whilst it has been a lot of hard work for some very tired students and staff, it was a fantastic way to end the year. Their boundless joy and enthusiasm shone through and the production was great, reminding me just how wonderful our young people and staff are. I am very grateful to everyone who gave up so much of their time to make sure that our students' talent could be shared in such a spectacular way. Another memory to cherish! ☺

I hope you enjoy reading the enclosed Newsletter. There is a lot going on and it is testament to the commitment of our students and staff that our young people are able to make the most of such a wide range of learning opportunities at Chilton Trinity both in the classroom and beyond it. ## CHILTON 2012

It has been a busy end to this Autumn Term. Progress with the building of the new school has moved forward at a real and visible pace.

### Trinity Sports and Leisure

At the start of November the new sports centre opened, and is proving to be an exciting and pleasant place for PE activities and assemblies. The old sports centre has been demolished and work will soon begin on the construction of the new hall, drama studio, and activity studio.

### Pool Construction

A new pool for Bridgwater is currently under construction and will form part of Trinity Sports and Leisure Centre. Students are excited and intrigued to see the new building go up. When finished it will be a wonderful facility for the public.

### Main School Build

The construction of the new school is moving to schedule and each of the federation wings is now constructed. Internal walls are springing up, along with all the mechanical and electrical fittings. Students, staff, and governors have taken advantage of site visits, and have been excited by what they have seen. All areas of the new school are 'indoors' so students and staff will not have to go outside in all weathers to move around the site.

The new school will open in November 2012 and our half term break will be extended in order to facilitate the move from the old Chilton Trinity into the new.

### Student involvement

Since the start of the project groups of students have had the opportunity to be involved in the build in a variety of ways. This term further work has been undertaken on the art features in the building. Landscape design and plants have been suggested by a student working group, and earlier in the term students in Key Stage 4 explored sustainability issues with a design consultancy from Bristol. A group of Key Stage 3 students have been organising a competition to suggest an appropriate name for the egg-shaped feature that will be built inside the main entrance. The results of this competition will be announced in the New Year.

### Access to our Playing Fields

Work has started on the construction of a footbridge to cross the rhyne near our Astro Turf Pitch. This will enable access to our playing fields, which have been extended to provide us with more outdoor sports space.
